

Know What To Do In An

EMERGENCY



Call 911 to Report an Emergency to Police/Fire/Ambulance OR

Call 617-747-2333 to Report an Emergency to Berklee Public Safety

EVACUATE

WHEN

If there is danger inside or near the building

ACTIONS

- Leave immediately via the nearest exit
- Don't run or use elevators
- Assist other occupants or inform emergency personnel of their location
- **Take** cell phone & valuables if they are close
- Move Away from building
- Wait for additional instructions or information

LOCKDOWN



WHEN

If there is an active shooter or other violence on campus

ACTIONS

- Run or escape from danger
- If you can't escape safely:
 Hide under furniture; lock and barricade doors; turn out lights; silence cell phone; remain quiet
- As a last resort, **Fight** to defend yourself
- **Call** 911 quietly if you have information for the police
- Wait for notice that the incident is over

SHELTER IN PLACE



WHEN

If there is an environmental or hazardous danger outside

ACTIONS

- Seek shelter inside a building, away from exterior windows & doors
- Shut windows and doors and seal them if possible
- Turn Off air conditioners, fans & heaters
- Wait for additional instructions or information
